Wednesday was the Lions International 4th of July Parade. Our new International President, and all the District Governors were inducted. That night there was a Lion's Night at the Wrigley Field with the Chicago Cubs and the fireworks afterwards were magnificent! It was great and as you looked around

there were fireworks going off all over Chicago. Thursday - we learned more about our International President and his ideas for the year. "The Challenge to Change" may include our clubs looking different from how they have looked in the past. Our membership may change to include younger people and more women. The kinds of activities that clubs engage in may need to change too. He encouraged us to listen to our new young members' ideas and be brave enough to make changes to ensure we keep them interested and engaged in the club.

On the last day of the Convention Former president Jimmy Carter spoke to us about the excellent work being done by SightFirstII and how it has virtually eradicated River Blindness from the world.

My theme for the year is "Loving Lions Care." We know all Lions care because of the things that Lions do to help others that are less fortunate than ourselves. But we seem to be the best kept secret in the world. We need to let people know what we do because when they know what we do for our own communities and learn about our world wide projects like Campaign SightFirst II they will want to be part of this wonderful organization. As your Governor for this year I look forward to our clubs growing and I am going to start two new clubs in our District. Most of all what ever you do this year make sure you have fun! Remember I am here for you. Anything I can do to help your club just give me a call.

I would like to thank all those concerned in putting together the All Star Football program especially Lion Elizabeth Gibbs-Olsen for being the chair person.
