LCIF



Lions Clubs International FOUNDATION

District 4-A1 had a banner year raising funds for LCIF. This is partly due to the Atwater Winton Lions being the first club in 4-A1 to be a 100% Melvin Jones Club. Total raised in funds was \$66,541.

I want to give a shout out to the following clubs who made donations or members made donations to LCIF. They are Arnold, Atwater Winton, Clements Lockeford, Escalon, Hughson, Jackson, Linden, Livingston, Lodi, Madera Evening, Merced Breakfast, Merced Golden, Modesto 500, Oakdale, North Fork, Patterson, Sonora, Stockton Delta Pacifica, Stockton Host, STOCKTON San Joaquin, Tracy Breakfast, and Tracy Tank Town.

I would encourage clubs to donate \$50 by either the club or members of the club. If every club would make this donation, then the district could be a 100% District. If every member made a donation of \$50 or more, then the club would receive a 100% club award.

Since LCIF's inception, they have given out over \$1.3 billion in grants worldwide. This past year, they gave out 1580 grants totaling \$46.4 million. California was #1 in the United States by raising over \$12 million in funds.

District 4-A1 has received over \$655,000 since the first grant was received in 1992. California has received \$7.8 million in grants. Your money does come back to your communities. Currently, the District 4-A1 is eligible to receive up to \$15,000 in community service grants. These funds are available for projects in the eight service areas that Lions Clubs supports. These are Childhood Cancer, Vision, Youth, Humanitarian Efforts, Hunger, Diabetes, Disaster Relief, and Environment.

CALIFORNIA LIONS CAMP

Equipment will be used on the playground to include trikes, bean bag toss game, soccer goals, playhouse, sand and water bench, basketball hoop, and more.

White Cane Awareness Day is October 15. [FLIER](#) - Will you join the celebration? To many, the image of a curved handled white cane has become the symbol of a plea for support of a disabled community in need. It's a symbol used by Lions Clubs and others to raise money for important services to prevent blindness or assist people who are blind. It was named "White Cane Safety Day" by the US Congress in 1964, or "Blind Americans Equality Day" as it was designated by President Barack Obama in 2014. The meaning is best exemplified by the updated logo/label you can purchase from Lions International: A solid blue circle with a current-day straight white cane with a White Cane Day banner attached noting "Lions Support" above the banner, and the words "Independence, Mobility, Safety," below the banner.



Whether a blind person uses a white cane or a guide dog to improve their access to and independence in the world, White Cane Day is a celebration of the abilities and achievements of the blind and a commitment to inclusion, accessibility, and safety - locally and internationally. As we approach that day, I encourage all Lions Clubs to join in the celebration to increase awareness of the meaning and importance of the white cane among our Lions Clubs and within our communities!

Mobilize your club to partner with local blindness experts, schools, and organizations for the blind to plan your International White Cane Awareness Day activity. Here are some suggestions from Lions International:

Through **October 31, 2024**, California's Lions Clubs are encouraged to submit "Back-to-School" grant requests to the California Lions Foundation (CLF). The Back-to-School Grant monies are to be used to help our youth from preschool through high school ages for their school needs. It includes the following general requirements which are further specified in the attached application:

Grants are up to \$500 per club.

Grant applications must include a full description of the project and details of the expected cost.

Grant applications must show how Lions are directly involved in hands-on execution of the project and management of the grant funds

Lions clubs who have not successfully completed the requirements of past CLF grants or currently have outstanding grants will not be eligible

Grant applications must include the District Governor, District CLF Board Member, and Club President review and signature approval.



BACK-TO-SCHOOL GRANT

[California Lions Foundation](#) (CLF) has the [Back-To-School Grant program](#). [See article in this newsletter.] Four clubs in our district will get \$500 to provide a hands-on project to the students or the schools. They also have lower-limit matching grants and emergency grants. Please check with Lion Todd Riebe for details and donate to CLF.

NOTE: We also get grants from them to help our clubs and communities.

"Where there is a need, there is a Lion." The district would like to know if Back-To-School is a worthwhile topic. The district could team up with different clubs to apply for CLF and LCIF matching grants for all our Back-To-School Projects. The \$2500 would match with CLF's \$2500 to generate \$5000 - and it could be matched with LCIF's \$5000. It could be tougher for a single club; but by teaming up, the district and the clubs could work together to bring more help to our communities.

Please bring your ideas to my attention. The district is here to serve your club.

MEMBERSHIP DEVELOPMENT GRANT

Talking about grants. Our district submitted a [Membership Development Grant](#) request to Lions International. Our cabinet also approved \$6000 for the Global Action Team operation, including training for our district and club officers, membership development, and new clubs' development and service reporting.

COUNCIL OF GOVERNOR (COG) MEETINGS

This year, the Council had Zoom meetings with different committees multiple times before the in-person meeting. We can now cut down a day for the Council of Governor's meeting in August (thus saving the Multiple District \$30,000). In October, we will have another virtual COG which saves another \$30,000, plus travel costs.

STRIKE TEAM OR CAT OR CLUB ASSISTING TEAM can serve our district by training officers and Certified Guiding Lions.

STUDENT SPEAKERS CONTEST (SSC)

Each year, the SSF sets aside \$4500 to be awarded to our District Student Speakers Contest winner. Along with the Area and State winners, the number is \$7000 each year which is in our district's fundraising goal each year. Unfortunately, our district effort is near the bottom of the list, as ranked among other districts. So, I am going to challenge each club to donate \$200 to obtain a [Harry J. Aslan Fellow](#). Then your club could give the nice plaque to anyone - such as your club's Student Speakers Contest Chairperson. 100% of your and your club's donation goes to scholarships. SSF is a 501(c)3 organization.

One more point, part of our dues goes to the Student Speakers Contest that deals with the operation side of the contest. That pays for payroll for our part-time employee(s) to print and organize club packets and postage to clubs. None of our dues go into scholarship. (If the council has funds left over in a year, it is possible the Council could choose the charity to donate to via discretionary fund.)

AREA LEADER 1B GLOBAL ACTION TEAM ZOOM

It's the "Year of the GAT." From the Lions International, to our Multiple District, to our 4-A1 District, the GATeam (GET, GLT, GMT, GST or extension for new clubs, leadership, membership, service teams) are working together, ever closer than before. We will update District Goals (not DG goals) and our action plan every two weeks. Please consider having your club's Vice President entered on the [Lion Portal](#) as GLT or Global Leadership Team Club Coordinator - and recruit a Membership Chair and Service Chair. Information will be shared and their feedback will be heard. We will strategize with options to enhance our service. Just bringing information back to your club will be beneficial.
