GLASSES – PULL-TAB PICKUP ANYWHERE IN DISTRICT 4-A1



Recently, the boundary for pickup of glasses, pull tabs, and ink cartridges has been extended to include all of District 4-A1 – from Lodi to the Yosemite Zone – from Upcountry to Dos Palos. All that is needed are at least 25 pair of glasses and a phone.

The first part is easy, but you must want to do it. Folks around Linden have contacted local eye doctors and established a monthly route that nets 100-150 pair per month. The hospitals contribute a like amount. The club has a central box for members to put the few pair they might have.

Results: 300-400 pairs of glasses per month from Linden. Who knows what this type of plan or any variation would bring your club? Pull tabs and cans can be picked up with the glasses; but please keep them separated.

The second part is just as easy as the first. Grab a phone and call 510-910-3755. This will put you in contact with Paul Wagner, who will schedule a pick-up with you at your location. Remember, every pair counts when we have needy people. CALL ME!

- District: \$600 (Not to exceed actual expenses)

- Zone: \$300 (Not to exceed actual expenses)
- Club: \$250 (Not to exceed actual expenses)

Through October 31, 2024, California's Lions Clubs are encouraged to submit "Back-to-School" grant requests to the California Lions Foundation (CLF). The Back-to-School Grant monies are to be used to help our youth from preschool through high school ages for their school needs. It includes the following general requirements which are further specified in the attached application:

1. Grants are up to \$500 per club.
2. Grant applications must include a full description of the project and details of the expected cost.
3. Grant applications must show how Lions are directly involved in hands-on execution of the project and management of the grant funds
4. Lions clubs who have not successfully completed the requirements of past CLF grants or currently have outstanding grants will not be eligible
5. Grant applications must include the District Governor, District CLF Board Member, and Club President review and signature approval.





Connecting to Young Lions

Your guide to service events and clubs that are attractive to Young Lions.

How am I defining “younger?” If your club’s average age is 60 years old, consider working to invite more members that are around age 50. Starting with adding members slightly younger than your club members’ average age is a great way to begin building strong, multi-generational clubs! If your club is interested in inviting members approximately **40 years old and younger**, then question your club’s attractiveness to Young Lions.

Is my club attractive to Young Lions? It starts with understanding service interests that matter to them and being aware of their hectic schedules and communication preferences.

- Be mindful and **respectful of schedules** that may be vastly more limited than your own, especially those attending college or parents of young and teenage children.
- Be open to inviting younger members to **form a club branch**. This will provide an exciting opportunity to feel they are part of your club while meeting independently

and focusing on service initiatives they are passionate about. LINK: lionsclubs.org/club-branch.

- Young Lions prefer to communicate digitally via text messaging and are active on social media.
- Be open to new ideas and allow Young Lions to lead service events and meetings in their own unique way. The more opportunities people are given to have an active voice, the more drive they'll have to stay in your club.

Recruit Young Lions through service

The Lions Clubs International motto is “We Serve”.

Plan your event

- Start your recruitment with a service event, not a meeting.
- Find out what is important to young people in your community. Perform a Club and Community Needs Assessment to understand issues that matter to them. **LINK: lionsclubs.org/service-toolkit**. Speak directly with young community members — this shows them you care as much as they do.
- Plan a **hands-on, family-friendly event** that addresses a need important to young people in your community. **LINK: lionsclubs.org/family-membership**
 - Invite a **variety of young people**, such as local college students, neighborhood groups, parent groups, young local professionals and younger colleagues from your workplace. Use social media to attract young people; meet them on their level!
 - Make sure that all your events are **fun, energized and dynamic** — young people prefer active service events!
 - Ensure that there will be tangible outcomes so that everyone feels they have contributed to making a positive impact.

During your event

- Start on time, with a brief orientation beforehand.
- Supply enough tools and materials for everyone to be engaged.
- Engage younger people in the service and not just the “heavy lifting” and clean-up.
- **Take pictures** of everyone you invited.
- **Thank** everyone and ask them how they enjoyed being “a Lion for the day.”

After your event

- Share pictures you took on social media.
- Remember to **follow up** and invite prospective Young Lions to join you for another service event. Encourage them to bring friends and family members.

General meeting tips

- Start and end meetings on time, and be aware of the limited time of parents of young and school-age children.
- Keep meetings brief and efficient. **Officers and committees can meet separately before or after the club**

meeting. The most successful clubs keep their meetings to **an hour or less**.

- Schedule time at the beginning of each meeting for **new ideas**.
- Make service a part of every meeting. **Celebrate your service accomplishments.** Show photos and share thank you notes. Plan easy service tasks that can be completed during meetings.
- Consider **online meetings** when possible, or allow members to join live meetings by using an online platform.
- Do not serve formal meals. **Snacks** are welcomed, but plan social events, such as formal meals, separately from your meeting.
- Have a plan to keep club members' **children occupied**. Assign someone to help with homework, lead coloring/craft projects, or lead school-age children in planning a service event for local children in need. Visit lionsclubs.org/family-membership to explore helpful ways to guide and mentor children in your club with The Family Cub Program.
- Create **excitement** about upcoming events and **celebrate** each member's contributions.

Involve Young Lions

- Allow Young Lions to help lead and run the meeting.
- Use the social media skills of your club's Young Lions to promote service events and reach out to prospective Young Lion members — their networking and social media knowledge is a great benefit to your club!
- Ask Young Lions about service initiatives that are important to them.
- Allow Young Lions to plan service projects that they are passionate about.



Dear Leo Leader,

We hope your Lion year is off to a great start! This year, you will have many opportunities to develop your leadership, communication and organizational skills as you encourage Leos to implement impactful service in your community. Throughout the year, your Leo district and multiple district will be setting goals for activities they are planning and opportunities for Leo education. Below are some excellent resources, tips and tricks to assist you.

- **Report Your Club Officers** – If your Leo district or multiple district hasn't already assigned their officers for the year, make sure to do so soon. This includes the new [Leo membership chairperson roles](#)! To expedite reporting, assign new Leo district/multiple district officers via the [Lion Portal](#). If you are unable to report via the Lion Portal, submit the [Leo Districts and Multiple Districts Officers Annual Report](#) form to Lions International as soon as possible. Work with your Leo club advisors to make sure that not only are they reported, but all of the Leo club officers in your area are reported.
- **Goal Setting** – When your Leo district or multiple district is ready to set goals for the year ahead – whether for a service activity, team-building event, training opportunity, fundraiser or membership campaign – use this [Goal Setting Action Plan template](#) to guide your goal setting. Make sure you


engage the other Leo and Lion leaders in your area to establish their goals as well.

- **Leo Education** – One of your district/multiple district's goals may be to provide more learning opportunities for Leos to help them develop their personal and professional skills. District and multiple district leaders should hold Leo club officer trainings (apply for a [Leo Leadership Grant](#) to help with this!) and establish an annual Leo learning and development calendar. The [Leo Advancement Sessions](#) provide opportunities for Leos to develop and enhance their leadership skills. You should also encourage Leo members to expand their learning record by participating in locally planned Leo learning events as well as by completing courses in the [Lions Learning Center](#). Coordinate with your GLT and encourage Leos to take part in an Emerging Lions Leadership Institute so that your district or multiple district can receive the new [ELLI Leo grant funding](#).

Throughout the year, the Leo Club Program Department will contact you to provide program updates and remind you of important dates and relevant resources. In the meantime, you can find additional information at lionsclubs.org/leos. If you have any questions about your role, please do not hesitate to contact us at leo@lionsclubs.org. 


