Some are unable to go to their prom because they are hospitalized, and others are just embarrassed to have to go to the prom bald. 



On October 5th, a Club Officers Training was held at VIPs in Modesto. Eight clubs and 23 participants attended the workshop (from Linden, Patterson, Atwater, Madera Evening, Lathrop, Tracy Tank Town, Tracy Breakfast). Each participant received a binder that provided them with copies of the e-books, Global Action Team job descriptions, service ideas, and much more. They will be a great resource when trying to locate items on the Lions International website.

- **Additional Club Officer Team training is planned for January 4th** – This training will be in-person in the San Joaquin Region & on **January 11th** in the Mountain Region.

Each new member receives a welcome letter with information about the newsletter and various resources available to them as a new member.

Town Hall Meetings (Zoom) are held on the 3rd Monday of the month at 6-7PM. These meetings focus on assisting officers and Lions with Lion Portal challenges, general questions, finding resources, and training on areas identified by district members. On October 21st, we demonstrated the process on the Lion Portal to successfully enter and submit service and administration activities, how to access a Leo Club to enter information (only Club Secretary has access), and a few tricks to successfully complete member and service activities so the data transfers across platforms.

This is an opportunity to ask questions and resolve challenges. Short trainings of 10 to 15 minutes will also be provided throughout the year. This is an easy way to get answers and share with other Lions.

Rebuild Club Meeting (Zoom) are held monthly on the 4th Friday of the month. Any Lion or Club is welcome to join the meeting. 2. Grant applications must include a full description of the project and details of the expected cost.
3. Grant applications must show how Lions are directly involved in hands-on execution of the project and management of the grant funds

4. Lions clubs who have not successfully completed the requirements of past CLF grants or currently have outstanding grants will not be eligible
5. Grant applications must include the District Governor, District CLF Board Member, and Club President review and signature approval.

Canva is a great platform to make all sorts of marketing materials for the Lions Clubs in MD4, including flyers, banners, postcards, promotional items, social media posts and many more. There is a not-for-profit version of Canva that gives full capability to work as a team across the clubs in MD4. This would allow for the creation of customizable Lions marketing designs that could be shared across MD4.

For example, take an initiative like the Lions Cancer month in February. MD4 marketing creates a Canva flyer template for Childhood Cancer and then invites our MD4 District Marketing Leads, or a Club Marketing Lead to that team to modify if for their local projects.

The beauty of Canva is that the Canva for Teams version allows a faster start with many pre-made templates and art designs that are not available in the free version. 




