#### COLLECT & TURN IN USED EYEGLASSES AND PULL-TABS



Glasses: As your chairperson for glasses recycling, I wish to thank the more than 16 clubs who contributed to the truckload of 8,000 pairs of glasses that were taken to Vallejo last Sunday. These will be cleaned, scanned for prescriptions, boxed, and either sent to existing Lions in Sight facilities around the world for distribution or used in temporary clinics in many third-world countries. Your contributions are being put to good use. As I said: "More than 16 clubs participated". We do not know how many others donated because there were many boxes/bags of glasses with no names or amounts on them. If you are coming to a District Meeting, please remember to at least put your club name on each container and (if you have time) the number of glasses in it. Thank you.



Pull-Tabs: Nearly 100 pounds of pull-tabs were picked up at the District Meeting. These will go to the Ronald MacDonald House in Sacramento where the recycler matches any funds earned. We have yet to involve the House in Madera, but that is a possibility in the future. Again, please put your club's name on the containers. Remember to record your donations in the Lion Portal.

District 4-A1 LIONISM AWARDS CRITERIA



The district winners will be awarded at the 2025 District 4-A1 Convention; and winners will become nominees for the 2026 MD4 Convention Academy Awards.

The following award criteria is provided:

#### District 4-A1 Lion of the Year

Districts wishing to participate should submit their District Lion of the Year for any eligible Lion for service from July 1 to present or through June 30 of the Lion Year. Consideration for this award can include service at District-level and above. All Lions in good standing within their Club, District, and MD4 are eligible.

#### District 4-A1 Leo of the Year

Districts wishing to participate should submit their District Leo of the Year for any eligible Leo for service during the period July 1 to present or through June 30 of the Lion Year. Consideration should be given to service and accomplishments outside of Leo as well as participation in Leo Clubs activities and support of their District. All Leo in good standing within their Club, District, and MD4 are eligible.

#### District 4-A1 Leo Project of the Year

This award is designed for a Club that has a project; for which the Club is most renowned. The amount of money spent can be considered and the project could be a fundraiser. Districts wishing to participate should nominate projects done during the time period July 1 to present or through June 30 of the Lion Year.

#### District 4-A1 Couple of the Year Award

A couple selected by their District Governor will have shown exemplary leadership on behalf of the District and Multiple District, based on the theme, "One World, One Heart". Service through the years should be considered, not just during the current year. A couple receiving this award may consist of a Lion and a significant other who does not have to be a Lion.

#### District 4-A1 Most Outstanding Project for the Year (Small Club, Medium Club, and Large Club, Pending approval for Extra Large Club)

This award is designed for a Club that has a project for which the Club is most renowned. The amount of money spent can be considered and the project could be a fundraiser. Districts wishing to participate should nominate projects done during the time period July 1 to present or through June 30 of the Lion Year.

#### Project of the Year

District Governors may nominate one Club in each category.

- Small Club is a club with 20 or fewer members.
- Medium Club is a club with 21 to 39 members.
- Large Club is a club with 40 or more in membership MD4 Lions Club of the Year

This award is designed for a Club who has gone above and beyond in their service to their community during the period July 1 to present or through June 30 of the Lion Year. It should embody our motto "We Serve". The amount of money spent should NOT be a consideration, and the project should NOT be a Club fundraiser.

The Club project(s) should be "hands-on" in nature and for which members turn out to do physical labor or service for the betterment of their community.

#### Club of the Year

Tell the district why this Lions Club should be nominated.

## PLANNING A RAFFLE AT ONE OF YOUR FUNDRAISING EVENTS?

Here is what you need to know:

You need to register with the State of California for a Raffle Permit if you are going to have an event or fundraiser raffle. Valid for one year from January 1 to December 31.

Only need one permit regardless of number of event raffles where public is attending.

Fill out form CT-NRP-1 in January (or at least 60 days prior to your event.)

Submit your CT-NRP-1 entity status letter and \$30.

Wait for your confirmation letter.

Host your raffle and keep the raffle money separate from other event activities.

Fill out and submit your CT-NRP-2 report by February 1st.

In-Club raffles are not included in the above – only events or fundraisers where the public is attending.

## BECOMING KNIGHTS OF THE BLIND

Born in Tuscumbia, Alabama, USA, in 1880, Helen Keller developed a fever at 18 months of age that left her blind and deaf.

With the help of an exceptional teacher, Anne Mansfield Sullivan of the Perkins School for the Blind, Helen Keller learned sign language and braille. A few years later, she learned to speak. As an adult she became a tireless advocate for people with disabilities. And in 1925, she attended the Lions Clubs International Convention and challenged Lions to become "knights of the blind in the crusade against darkness."


Former U.S. President 1924 - 2024



**MADERA CUBS**



Growing up in a family dedicated to service has left an indelible mark on siblings GR (10) and Kinsey (9) Stickler. As the children of Matt and Maggie Stickler—1st Vice District Governor and Cabinet Secretary of MD 4-A1—the pair have been immersed in the Lions Clubs' mission nearly their entire lives. GR attended his first Lions meeting at just three months old, accompanying his father, then a member of the Madera Breakfast Lions Club.

Today, GR and Kinsey play an active role in community service projects alongside their parents, continuing the family's legacy of giving back. Their enthusiasm caught the attention of MD 4-A1 District Governor Eric Cheung, who saw an opportunity to spotlight service from a child's perspective. He encouraged GR and Kinsey to come up with an idea for a project that reflected their unique interests and passions.

#### Turning an Idea into Reality

GR and Kinsey came up with "Joy in a Bag," a project combining their love for art and STEM to create bags filled with creative supplies and activities for kids and teens. The goal was simple yet impactful: to provide children with something that brings happiness, creativity, and a sense of ownership.

With the support of Past District Governor Gabrielle McKechnie, the idea quickly gained momentum. McKechnie secured a \$5,000 Community Impact Grant to fund the project, giving GR and Kinsey the green light to fill their "cart" with supplies. Markers, crayons, painting kits, puzzles, [Lego Glasses](#), and STEM kits were just some of the items they selected. As supplies arrived, the Stickler family, along with Past Council Chair Claudia Miller, worked tirelessly to organize the materials. Claudia even hand-stamped all 200 bags, ensuring a personal touch in each one. The project came together through a combination of teamwork, creativity, and the shared commitment of the Lions community.

#### The Big Day

On January 18th, "Joy in a Bag" was unveiled at the MD 4-A1 District Meeting. Watching their vision come to life was a proud moment for GR and Kinsey as Leos and Lions worked side-by-side to assemble the bags.

The completed bags were distributed to Lions members, who took them back to their communities to support various organizations, including children's hospitals, CASA programs, youth transition programs, and local police stations. GR and Kinsey will deliver bags to Valley Children's Hospital in Madera, CA themselves, ensuring the project has a direct and personal impact on their community.

#### A Team Effort

The success of "Joy in a Bag" is a testament to the power of collaboration. From the initial grant writing by Gabrielle McKechnie, to the hands-on assembly by Lions and Leos, the project demonstrated how a community can come together to make a difference.

District Governor Eric Cheung praised the siblings' leadership, highlighting how their project has inspired Lions members across the district. "What GR and Kinsey have accomplished shows the power of involving young people in service," he said. "Their creativity and dedication remind us that anyone, no matter their age, can make a difference."

#### A Family Tradition of Service

The Stickler family's commitment to service is deeply rooted in Lions' values. Whether it's organizing projects or attending meetings, GR and Kinsey have grown up watching their parents lead by example. "Joy in a Bag" is not just a

reflection of their own passions, but it's a testament to the power of families working together to create positive change.

#### Looking Ahead

"Joy in a Bag" is more than a one-time project—it's an example of how small ideas can grow into something extraordinary with the right support and teamwork. The Sticklers hope their project will inspire other young people and families to get involved in their communities and explore the joy of giving back.
