

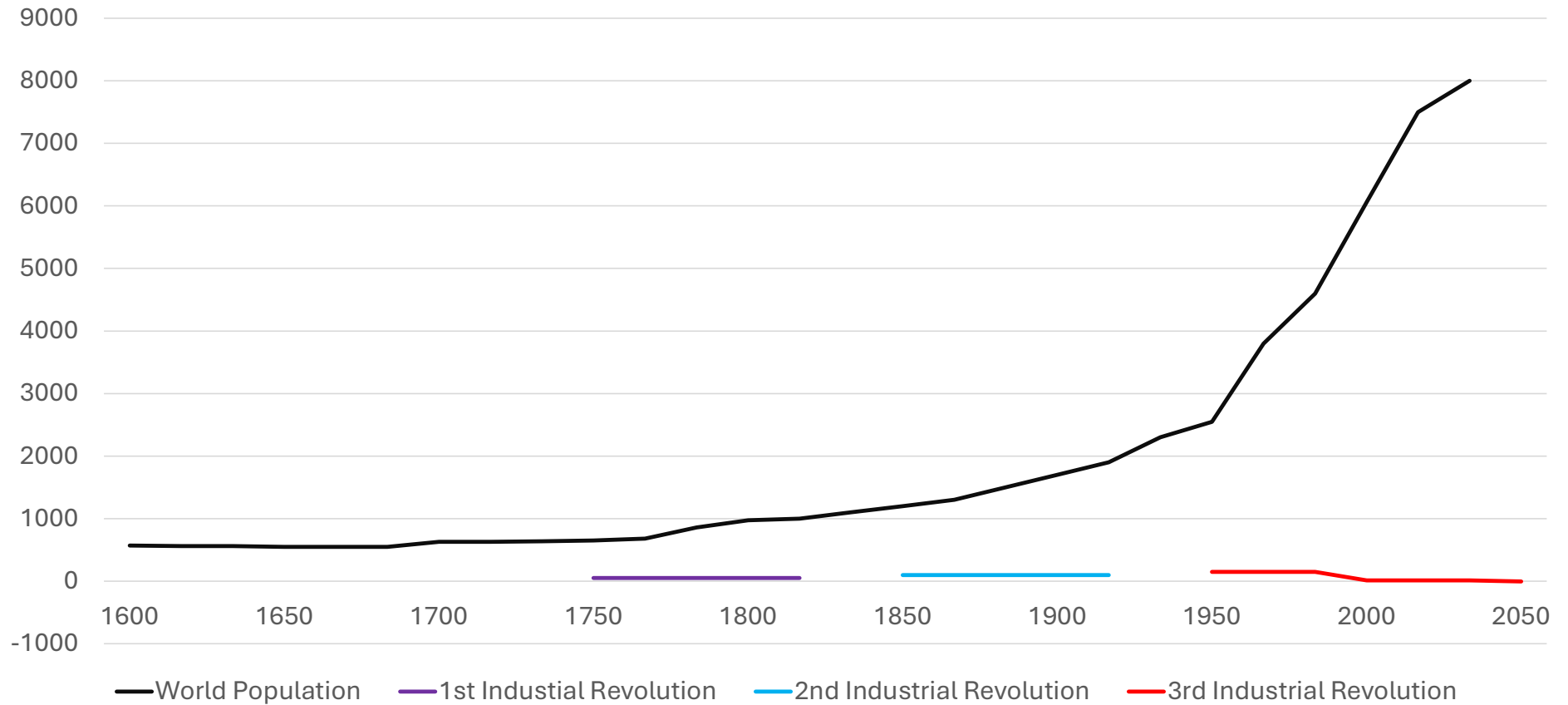

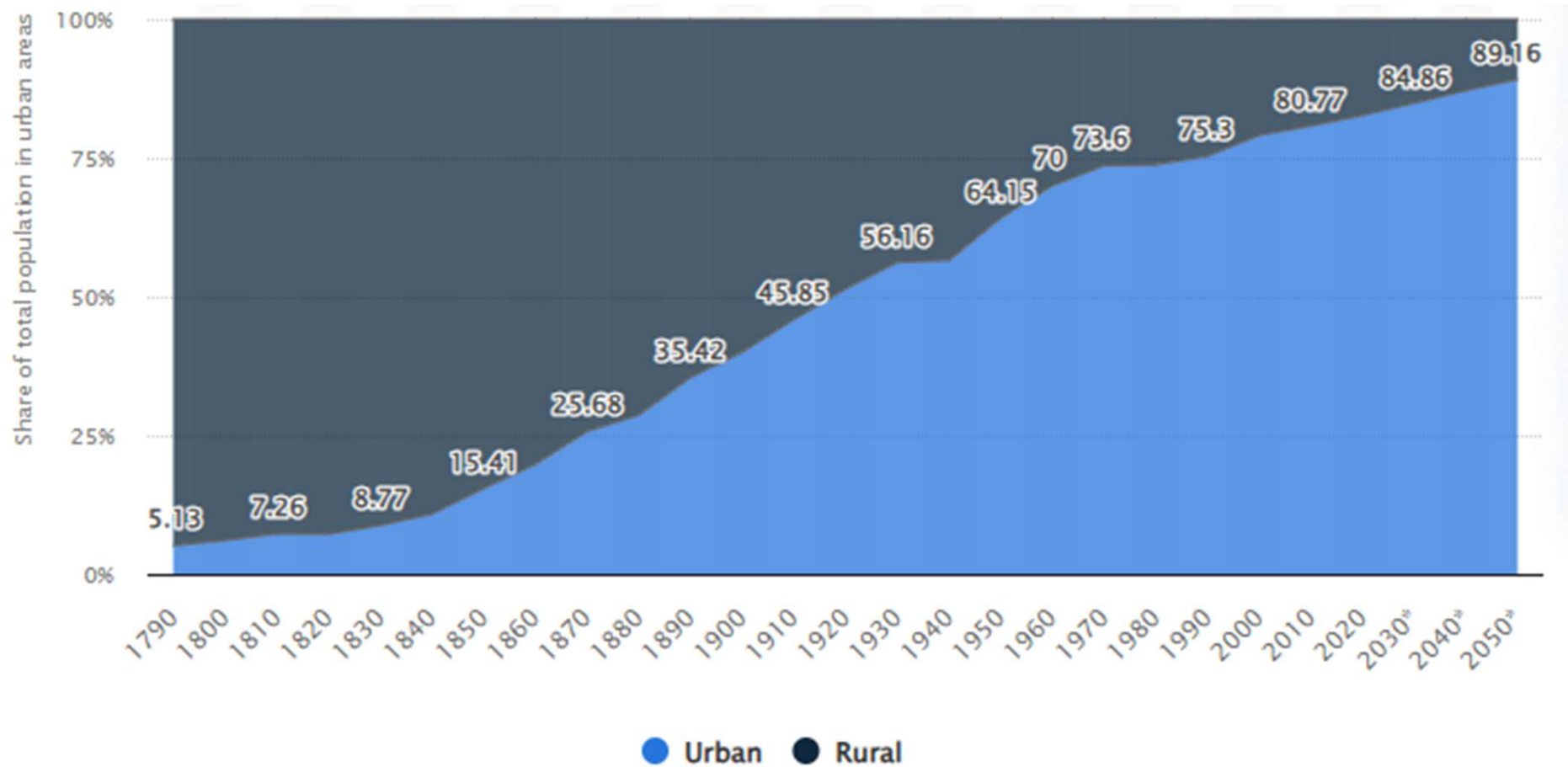

SUMMARY OF POPULATION, URBANIZATION & TECHNOLOGY CHANGES 1950 - 2050

Population – World - 2.8 to 10.4 billion – more than 3 1/2 times

- US – 151 to 372 million – almost 2.5 times
- California – 10.6 to 43 million – more than 4 times

Urbanization - US – 57.6% to 89.6%

- California is already over 90 %

Technology – party telephone lines to cell phones and social media – virtual reality

IMPACTS OF POPULATION, URBANIZATION & TECHNOLOGY CHANGES

- ❖ Technology change leads to
 - increased life expectancy – population growth and aging
 - increased work productivity – more service-oriented economy
 - globalization
- ❖ Increased Population leads to
 - increased resource extraction and depletion
 - increased waste disposal and greenhouse gases
- ❖ Increased Urbanization
 - Less contact with natural environment
