This year, nine clubs used the Vision Screening Cameras. That amounted to over 5000 screening with over 1125 referrals. This is a 22% referral rate, which is extremely high. The following clubs did screenings, either at schools or they had health fair screenings: Merced Breakfast, Merced Golden, Mokelumne Hill, Oakdale, Patterson, STOCKTON San Joaquin, Los Banos, and Waterford. Patches have been made for the 2024-25 year to put on your banners, and they will be distributed in the next couple of weeks. Thanks to all the clubs participating in this endeavor. TAXES' INFORMATION



REMINDER: Don't forget to file your club's *Return of Organization Exempt From Income Tax*.

May 15th is the final day to file for Lions Fiscal Year End 6/30/2024 if you are on EXTENSION AND DID NOT FILE A RETURN BY NOVEMBER 15, 2024.

- An organization must file Form 990, if it has gross receipts of \$200,000 or more, or total assets of \$500,000 or more.
- Form 990-EZ, Short Form if annual gross receipts are less than \$200,000, and total assets at the end of its tax year are less than \$500,000.
- Form 990-N (e-Postcard) An organization, whose annual gross receipts are normally \$50,000 or less, may file Form 990-N (postcard)

Update of our California Lions Foundation Grant...





The diabetes class was a successful event, bringing together a diverse group from the community that included Alpha Leos, one Omega Leo, several Lions from the STOCKTON San Joaquin Lions Club, a member from the Stockton Delta Pacifica Club, and a representative from the Linden Lions Club. The session was led by Inez Ruiz-Hudson, the VP of Civic Engagement, who provided a detailed presentation on diabetes, the link between genetics and the disease, and how to manage portion sizes. She also shared valuable resources with the attendees.

While Inez shared her knowledge, participants enjoyed an ambrosia salad that they had prepared themselves. Each participant also received a pack of three pairs of diabetic socks. The class was an engaging and interactive way to learn about diabetes management.


