MD-4 YOUTH PROTECTION COMPLIANCE

All Club Presidents, Secretaries, and Marketing Chairs received an email on July 22nd regarding the MD4 Youth Protection Policy, which states that by **July 31, 2025**, all California Lions Clubs must complete a "MD4 Youth Service Compliance Form." This form must be completed annually, even if your club does not participate in any youth service programs/activities wherein you have club members or volunteers who have direct contact or supervision of minors for 16 hours or more per month or 32 hours or more per year.

As of 8/24/25, I have received compliance forms from Bass Lake, Ceres, Copperopolis-Lake Tulloch, Denair, Escalon, Gustine, Jackson, Lathrop, Linden, Livingston, Mariposa, Merced Healthy Leo Lions, Modesto 500, Moke Hill, Murphys-Angels, Oakdale, Patterson, Sonora, Stockton Delta Pacifica, Stockton Host, Stockton San Joaquin, Sutter Creek, Tracy Breakfast, Tracy Tank Town, Turlock, Upcountry 88, and West Point Lions Clubs. Stockton Healthy Leo Lions Club is pending a live scan. THANK YOU! **We still have 22 more clubs that need to submit the required Youth Protection Compliance forms.**

The typical youth service programs that Lions Clubs are involved in that may have volunteers that have direct contact and/or supervision of minors for 16+/32+ hours include, but are not limited to: school-based and non-school-based Leo Clubs, Lions Youth Exchange, scholarship programs, youth camps, mentoring, and literacy programs.

School-based Leo Clubs that meet on the school site, have a faculty School Advisor, and follow the California school district clearance policy and procedures are exempt from this policy. The Leo activities in these Leo Clubs are considered a school-based activity. A

verification letter from the school district identifying the Youth Advisor and the name of the Leo Club is required for MD4 records. Lion Club volunteers who assist the Faculty School Advisor, and meet the 16+/32+ hour threshold, must comply with the Youth Protection Policy. Non-school based Leo Officers and volunteers who meet the 16+/32+ hour threshold are not exempt from this policy.




10 Ways to Experience Blindness Awareness



- 1. Blindfold Walk with a White Cane** – Experience navigating an obstacle course safely while blindfolded and using a cane.
- 2. Dining in the Dark (Mini Version)** – Sample snacks while blindfolded to rely on other senses.
- 3. Braille Name Cards** – Learn the Braille alphabet and emboss your name.
- 4. Accessible Technology Demo** – Try screen readers and accessibility tools.
- 5. Blindfolded Art or Lego Challenge** – Create something using only touch.
- 6. Guiding Skills Experience** – Practice sighted guide techniques with a partner.
- 7. Mystery Object Identification** – Identify objects using touch while blindfolded.
- 8. Blindfold Sports/Games** – Play adapted games like goalball or tossing a beeping ball.
- 9. Courtesy Rules of Blindness Roleplay** – Act out respectful ways to interact with blind individuals.
- 10. Storytelling with a Blind Guest Speaker** – Hear real experiences and Q&A.

Dear Lion Doug Campbell,

Hi, this is Elizabeth. I wanted to express my sincere gratitude for your support in helping me join the Lions International YCE program in Tokyo, Japan.

This experience was truly something special, something I never could've imagined without your help. I learned so much, not just about Japan, but also about myself. My host family welcomed me with such warmth, teaching me about their religious beliefs, family traditions, and even how to cook some of their favorite recipes. I brought back some ingredients and made miso soup for my family. It was a fun way to share a piece of the experience with them. Being part of their daily life gave me a whole new perspective.

I had the chance to visit beautiful temples and learn about Tokyo's rich history. I even went to a summer festival where I got to wear a yukata, and it was so fun! I got to play some traditional children's games that reminded me of a carnival. One of the coolest things was learning how to play the *koto* with my host dad. It's kind of like a guitar, and it was such a unique experience; especially since I have never played an instrument before. We also went to Mt. Takao together, which was a great bonding moment for all of us.

At camp, we attended a morning service at a temple, which was both peaceful and eye-opening. I enjoyed all the team-bonding activities, which brought us closer together and made the experience even more memorable. One of the highlights was visiting Shibuya and seeing the Tokyo Skytree. Standing at the top and looking out over the city made me realize just how small we are in this big world. Oh, and we also went to Mount Fuji and explored a famous ice cave, which was so refreshing, and got to escape the heat for a bit. :)

One of the best parts was meeting other Leos from around the world. We shared our cultures, discussed our countries, and even engaged in some in-depth conversations about politics and how things work in our respective countries. Saying goodbye was, honestly, really hard because we all became so close in such a short time.

I'm incredibly grateful for this opportunity. It's something I'll carry with me forever, and it wouldn't have happened without your support. I really hope more Leos get to have an experience like this; it's truly once-in-a-lifetime.



- **January 15:** Kits go on sale from the Club Supplies Sales Department at International Headquarters.
- **October 1:** Deadline to purchase kits from the Club Supplies Sales Department at International Headquarters.
- **November 15:** Postmark deadline for a club to send one winning poster (per contest sponsored) to the district governor.
- **December 1:** Postmark deadline for a district governor to send one winning district poster to multiple district council chairperson.
- **December 1:** Postmark deadline for a district governor not belonging to a multiple district to send one winning poster to the Brand & Creative Department at International Headquarters.
- **December 1:** Postmark deadline for a club not belonging to a district to send one winning entry to the Brand & Creative Department at International Headquarters.
- **December 15:** Postmark deadline for the multiple district council chairperson to send one winning poster to the Brand & Creative Department at International Headquarters.
- **February 1:** International winners notified on or before this date.
