Jessica's House will be purchasing more supplies for grief therapy sessions.



December 9 - At our Sutter Creek Lions meeting, a Scout from Troop 633 gave a presentation on his Eagle project to partner with the Amador County Library and develop a Children's Literacy & STEM Program using Legos.



We are always looking for ways to collaborate to achieve goals; and it was decided that we would provide Zach with our packages of "No Spark" Tow Chain Covers for him to raise the funds he needs for this project.

The covers are intended to provide a barrier between metal tow chains and asphalt, thereby preventing sparks that could ignite dry roadside vegetation.

Tow chain covers are made from retired, heavy duty fire hoses that are no longer used for firefighting. The Sutter Creek Fire Department has donated their retired hoses for this project; and the Sutter Creek Lions package them into pairs of covers.

Our meeting was held at Rosa's Cocina on Eureka Street where we enjoyed great food and great service.






