

From the DISTRICT GOVERNOR's DESK

Fellow Lions of District 4-A1,


LIONS OF DISTRICT 4-A1:

Leos have always been a strong influence in our District 4-A1. After my year as Governor (2021-22), I asked DG Doug Campbell (2022-23) to let me be his District Leo Advisor. I saw that many of our Leos and Leo Clubs lacked transition into Lion Clubs, as well as District recognition. Many of our Leos did not know they were sponsored by a Lions Club.

I made myself a 10-year plan. I wanted 7,000 members of our organization under the age of 31 to be reported by my 70th birthday.

My goal in year one (2022-23) was to clean up our roster and remove the Leo clubs that either did not make it through COVID or had long been set aside by the Lions club that sponsored them. In a way, I viewed my job as "Leo Region Chair." I reached out to sponsoring clubs and asked them to begin reporting their Leos, educating their Leos about the club that sponsored them, or consider cancelling the sponsorship of the Leo club if there was no longer viable Lions club support, allowing for better service reporting statistics.

In year two, the goal was to engage the Advisors and secure active advisors for the Leo Clubs. During this year many Leo Club Advisors joined with advisors from other clubs to participate in the USA/Canada Leo Leadership Conference both in Visalia (2022, 12 Leos attended) and in Chicago (2023, 48 Leos and Lions attended). District Leo Clubs' participation in the Tournament of Roses decorating barn (2022-2025), participation in LDUN (Lions Day at the United Nations), expanding participation in Lions International, Youth Camps and Exchange programs were among many other opportunities we have offered to our Alpha and Omega Leos.

For my third year, I applied and received appointment by the International Board of Directors to the Leo Club Advisory Panel. Here, I sit on the Transition Committee and review proposed changes to Board Policy on the Leo program. With the knowledge attained, I have continued with my 10-year plan to cultivate and establish knowledge about the programs afforded to our youth. My third-year goal was to educate and inform Lions members about these programs - and my appointment proved to educate me. Placement on the Transition Committee opened my eyes to opportunities beyond the Leo programs (Omega/Alpha) and encouraged me to education Leos and Lions beyond District 4-A1 throughout Constitutional Area 1, USA.

Dual Leo and Lion Membership allows our Omega Leos to transition into a Lions Club while still enjoying the security of bonds establish as an Omega. Lions International places very few restrictions on this transition period. In fact, they leave placement of restrictions in the hands of our District Leadership.

Recently it was brought to my attention that District 4-A1 leadership has established the "4-A1 Leo Lion Transition Policy", which allows only 30 days for transition. This policy removes all security and comfort in the transition period. I strongly encourage you to review Dual Leo and Lion Membership.

Additionally, I encourage review of a variety of membership types that are available to Young Lions and how to become a Leo Lion.

By encouraging and securing our young members in the future of our organization, we secure the future of Lions International's influence around the world.

Now in year four of my plan, the goal is to grow beyond Leos and encourage the formation of Leo Lions Clubs to foster and promote growth of our youth into your Lions club.

4-A1 LEO-LION TRANSITION POLICY

The 4-A1 2025-2026 Cabinet has established the Leo Lion Transition Policy to clarify the procedures for making a transition from Leo-to-Leo Lion. Leos can be part of an Alpha (13-18 years) or Omega (18-30 years) Club, or, at any time once turning 18 years may choose to become a Leo Lion. A Leo Lion is a Lion in all regards. The Leo in the Leo Lion name identifies the individual as having been a Leo for at least one year.

We are excited to have two Leo Lion Clubs in our District. A Leo Lion Club must have 10 Leo Lions to Charter such a club.

Thank you to all the Leo Advisors, Lions, and Leos who have helped make this a reality in District 4-A1. The transition period is to allow a Leo to determine if he/she wishes to remain an Omega Leo or to become a Leo Lion. Whatever choice the individual makes is the right choice for them. Both Leos and Lions serve.




