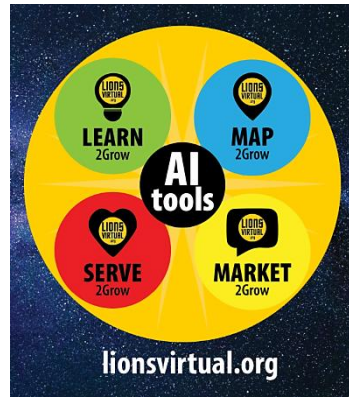
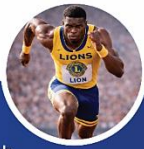

The 14-Day Growth Sprint Challenge

A Sprint is a short, focused push—10–14 days, not a forever project.

Pick one thing that’s slowing growth (volunteers, retention, visibility, follow-up), make one simple upgrade, and track one number to prove it worked.

The Sprint = 4 steps:

1. Name the barrier
2. Build one repeatable fix (follow-up, invite, event format, partnership, etc.)
3. Run it for 10–14 days
4. Track one metric

That’s the point: small, fast, repeatable wins.

Many clubs know they should be posting more consistently. The challenge isn't commitment – it's knowing what to post and how to make it look professional.
