Maneuver through a small obstacle course.
- One-Handed Task Station:
Perform tasks using only one hand.
- Hearing Loss Simulation:
Follow instructions with limited hearing.

Try reading or writing with altered vision.

Write one action to support accessibility.

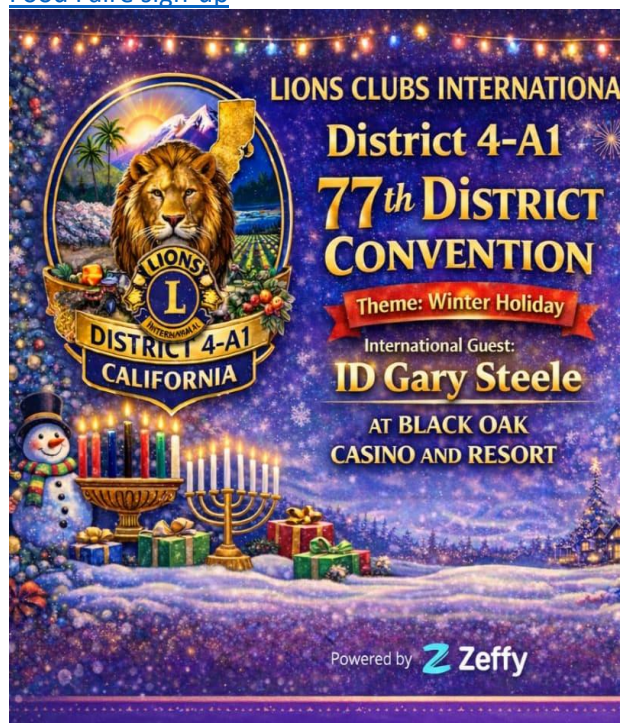

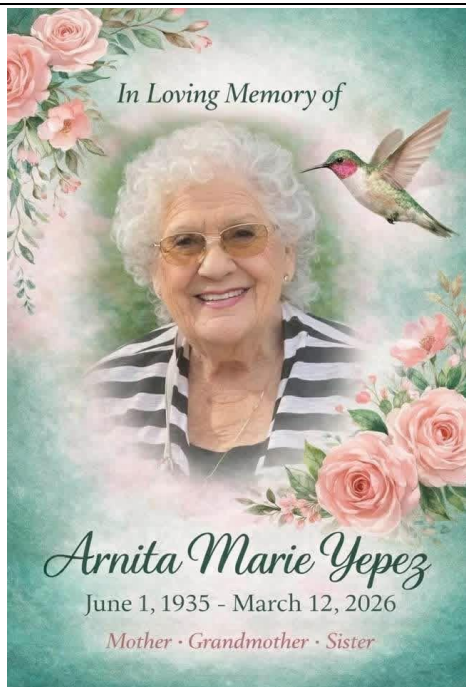

The Results are In!!

We would like to thank everyone who stopped by to donate blood or drop off a food donation on March 20. We collected 29 pints of blood. There were 21 whole blood donations, three Power Red donations, and two plasma/blood donations. **There were also three first time donors!**



Whole Blood Donation: Red blood cells carry oxygen throughout the body and must be transfused within 42 days. They can help replace blood lost in a car accident. This is why blood drives are so important.

Power Red: The most common blood components transfused to patients are red cells. When you give a Power Red (also called double red) donation, you double the impact of your donation because the automated procedure collects a concentrated donation of red cells that can help twice as many patients (some eligibility requirements apply).

Plasma/Blood: Plasma is 92 percent water and carries nutrients throughout the body and can be frozen up to 1 year. Plasma can help replace fluids and proteins after suffering from a burn.

We also collected 135 pounds of food that was taken to the Interfaith Food Bank.
