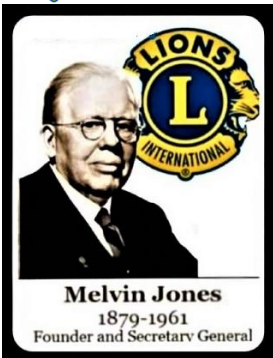

Subject: Golden Mussel

Good morning AFN & CC Advisory Committee members,

The Golden Mussel is an invasive freshwater species that has been identified in the San Joaquin County portion of the Delta. These small mussels are of great concern as they impact water conveyance and agriculture infrastructure by adhering to hard surfaces, in addition to ecological impacts to native species like the endangered Delta Smelt. They spread easily through water conveyance and overland boats and equipment. Because they reproduce quickly, early detection is important.

We need your help to share this information within your communities or by amplifying our messages directly from our social media pages.
