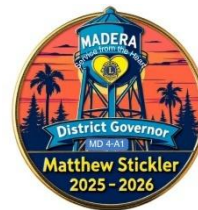

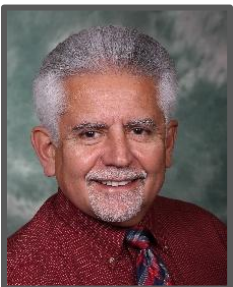

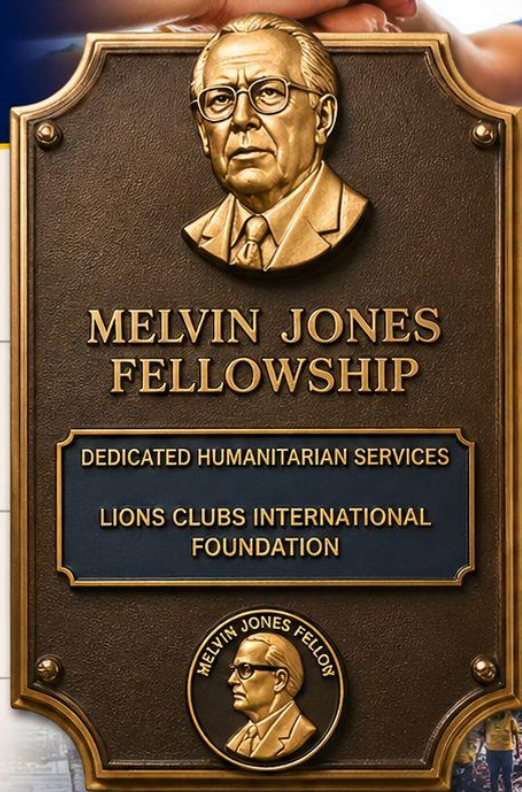

CLUB SERVICE CHAIR & SERVICE REPORTING - June 2026



Spotlight on Club [Service Reporting](#) and Club GAT Officer - the Club Service Chair -

As we close out the 2025-2026 Lions-year, let's finish strong by making sure our clubs have all reported our service in the [Lion Portal](#).

"We Serve" isn't just a catchy motto. It is what we Lions do! When new members are asked why they joined Lions, many answer "to make a difference in my community." When Lions are asked why they stay Lions, one of the most often cited reasons is: "I love all the ways we help the community." Service and member satisfaction go hand-in-hand.

It stands to reason that if we want to attract and keep members, we need to get the word out about the ways "We Serve" in our community. The first step is to get the service reported in the portal. As a reminder, when you enter your new officers for the year 2026-2027 into the portal, please be sure your club has a club service chair. This is a club officer position. They are part of the club's Global Action Team (GAT). Below is the Club Service Chair's job duties which suggest how clubs use the position. In the portal, the Club Service Chair can enter service in the portal. As the district GST (Global Service Team Coordinator), I partner with the Club Service Chairpersons to ensure our service is being reported and to accomplish other service-related needs. ~ Beth Estante, 4-A1 GST 2025-2026 and 2026-2027

Section 8. SERVICE CHAIRPERSON

The responsibilities for this position shall be as follows:

- (a) Serve as a key member of the club's Global Action Team as the club Service Chairperson.
- (b) Collaborate with the District Global Service Coordinator, Club LCIF Coordinator, district leaders, members of the club's service committee, and others to develop and communicate annual service goals and action plans. Goals and action plans should address current community needs and / or LCI's global causes, and can be comprised of advocacy and fundraising, in addition to direct service to beneficiaries.
- (c) Lead the service committee to implement the club's service action plans in order to achieve the club's service goals.
- (d) Incorporate opportunities for local youth and Leos to engage in all aspects of service activities, including goal setting, implementation, project evaluation, and reporting.
- (e) Report service activities to Lions Clubs International.
- (f) Serve as a club resource on current community needs by monitoring the service activities of other service clubs, developing community partnerships to expand service, and utilizing tools and resources offered by Lions Clubs International and Lions Clubs International Foundation.
- (g) Increase member satisfaction by encouraging participation and engagement in service projects.
- (h) Collaborate with the club membership chairperson and other club committees to promote membership opportunities to non-Lions during service projects.

(i) Attend the district governor’s advisory committee meeting of the zone in which this club is located when appropriate.

MD4Lions | 129 Los Aguajes Ave | Santa Barbara, CA 93101 US MD4 Council of Governors announces the establishment of a special convention from June 3 to June 5, 2026. The purpose of the convention is to obtain a vote of the general membership to approve the sale of the property at 129 Los Aguajes Ave, Santa Barbara, California. California Corporations Code Section 5911(a)(2) requires approval of the sale by the corporation's members "either before or after the transaction." The Council has decided it is in the best interests of the general membership and for full transparency to seek approval of the sale before its completion.

The convention will require registration and attendance at the event via Zoom, as permitted by California Corporations Code Section 5510(f). Clubs may begin entering their delegates in the Lions Portal beginning on or about May 3, 2026. Clubs and delegates must be in good standing to participate in the vote.

MD4 Property Business Case and Resolution Background:

At the direction of the 2024-2025 Council of Governors (COG) and with continued support of the current Council, the MD4 COG explored options concerning our property located in Santa Barbara. The Budget & Finance Committee was directed to prepare a business case in June 2025. Creating a business case:

1. Creating the business case included a records review, which determined the property title is clear. It is held in the name of Multiple District Four, Lions of California, a 501(c)4 corporation with no restrictions. It was learned that the land was donated and the building was constructed using member money.
2. A multi-year financial review showed that MD4 is currently incurring an average of \$22,000 annually to maintain the property. In addition, MD4 has foregone repairs over the years, including roof replacement and support beam replacement, estimated at over \$100,000. In addition to expenses related to the building, our history included using this space for employees hired to provide support to the Multiple. The cost of living in the Santa Barbara area is extremely high compared to the rest of the state. The annual cost for one employee included salary, health insurance, retirement fund investments, workers' comp insurance, and attendance at the LCI International Convention, which consumed approximately \$116,000 during the year 2018-2019, just before COVID.
3. With the advent of COVID, the MD4 office began shifting to a virtual office. The MD4 employee became a part-time employee working from home, and in 2023, the part-time employee was converted to a contract employee working from their place of business.
4. The building has become an unoccupied storage facility. This includes storage for the MD4 Flag display set, audiovisual equipment, some archived records, and other unused equipment. The MD4 COG needed to consider how to convert a nonproductive asset into one that will benefit MD4 membership going forward. Usage of the building has changed and is now functionally obsolete to the needs of MD4.

The COG considered three options in the business case: do nothing, leasing/rental, or selling.

Option 1 - Do nothing:

- Pro - Requires no action from the sitting COG during their respective year.
- Makes an office space available if the Multiple switches back to an employee model with a full-time office coordinator.
- Pro - Storage space is retained for flags, records, and equipment.
- Con - Annual ownership expenses continues at a \$22,000 rate annually adjusted for inflation.
- Con - Liability risk increases for each year the building sits vacant.
- Con - Location of the building, as the storage facility for flags and equipment, is not centrally located nor in proximity to the central travel corridor of California. Required travel time to retrieve and return the Flags and equipment exceeds 10 hours each direction at times and requires mileage reimbursement.
- Con - Security expenses increase while the building is vacant.
- Con - Significant increase in cost (\$70,000 or more) when hired employee(s) are required to use the building as an office.
- Con - If the Multiple converts back to an onsite employee model, approximately \$100,000 would be required for building repairs and an additional \$250,000 to bring the building into ADA compliance.

Option 2. Leasing/Renting

- Pro - Potential for annual income that offsets annual taxes and insurance.

- Pro - Liability risk is greatly reduced while the building is occupied.
- Con - Requires MD4 to perform the foregone repairs and maintenance before leasing the property.
- Con - Potentially, requires hiring of a company to manage leasing and or rental of property. Rates typically run 10% of the monthly rent.
- Con - Changing the purpose of this building to an office would not be approved by the city, as this is a Zone 4 area (housing or hotel). Changing the purpose of the building will eliminate the grandfathering under the previous Zone 4.
- Con – If the city agreed to the change in classification of the building, it would require approximately \$100,000 for building repairs and an additional \$250,000 to bring the building into ADA compliance for any lease.

Option 3. Selling Property

- Pro - Selling of property eliminates an annual tax and insurance liability of \$22,000 or more.
- Pro - Cost of an environmentally controlled space for storage of flags, records, and equipment is estimated at being less than \$158 per month, \$1900 annually. A budget trade-off of approximately \$20,100 annually.
- Pro - Income from the sale could provide a significant source of future income that could be used to reduce the need for increases in per capita tax to MD4 members, reduce the cost of conventions, and or increase training opportunities.
- Pro – Divesting the property would eliminate over \$350,000 in repair and upgrades.
- Con - Requires MD4 to obtain an alternate Santa Barbara address to satisfy California 501(c)4 corporate address requirements.
- Con - Requires MD4 lease/rent alternate storage for flags, records, and equipment in an environmentally controlled area.

MD4 engaged non-Lion legal counsel and a non-Lion real estate broker from the Santa Barbara area. We crosswalked the legal counsel's interpretation of our CBL with 2 members of our CBL committee independently to ensure our MD4 Constitution and Bylaws would allow the Council of Governors to take the needed actions to sell the MD4-owned building, since nothing in the Constitution and Bylaws prevented such a sale. Market analysis of this property determined the value range between \$1.0M and \$1.425M.

Subsequently, the attorney retained by the Council concluded that the sale would require a majority vote of the MD4 Delegates at a Convention, either before or after completion of the sale, per the California Corporations Code, and consent to the sale by the California Attorney General. The MD4 Constitution and By-Laws Committee is of the opinion that seeking a membership vote pre-approving the sale is proper since membership money and probably labor were used to build the building. Our constitution provides for the conduct of a special convention to handle business outside of our normal convention cycle. The Constitution and Bylaws Committee has expressed concern about the timing and procedural requirements for holding such a Convention in the time available between now and the International Convention (a CBL restriction). However, the MD4 COG has determined that the benefits to our members are significant and proceeding with a special convention to approve the sale is in the best interest of the membership and that doing so following proper registration, certification, and voting procedures is achievable.

As part of the business case and review of senior members of the Multiple, the recommendation was made to preserve the proceeds of the sale in perpetuity to support the Multiple's operations, as this asset was built and maintained using member dues. This verbiage is being developed by the CBL committee to be included in the measure with a focus on protecting the principle.

The Council reviewed the business case, voted, and unanimously approved proceeding with a divestiture of the asset located at 129 Los Aguajes Ave in Santa Barbara at the February 2026 Council of Governors meeting. The Council also approved the listing of the property at \$1.435M. As of April 12, 2026, we have received an offer of \$1.4M cash for the property. The Council has approved acceptance of this offer, and we are proceeding to a "Special Convention" vote with the delegates of our general membership to confirm approval of the sale. The special convention is entered into the Lions Portal, and clubs will be able to enter delegates on May 3, 2026.

MD4 Special Convention Delegates & Voting

- The Special Convention has the same rules and procedures as our regular convention.
- All clubs participating in the convention must be in financial good standing no later than May 18, 2026
- All delegates must be from clubs in good standing.

- The delegate ratio is 1 delegate per 10 full members of a club with a minimum of 12 months and 1 day of membership, as usual.
- **All delegates must be entered by June 1, 2026.**
- All PDGs/PCCs/PIDs must be members of clubs in MD4
- All delegates, DGs, PDGs, CC, PCCs, ID, PIDs, and PIP (aka MD4 Officers) must register for the convention via the Zoom link.
- All delegates, DGs, PDGs, CC, PCCs, ID, PIDs, and PIP must log in to the Zoom meeting on June 3 or June 4th to meet credentialing requirements.
- The election ballot will only be sent to those registered for the Zoom link and in attendance during June 3d or 4th.
- The Special Convention will be in session from 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm on **June 3rd and June 4th**. Agenda will follow.
- Voting will take place on June 5th from 7:30 am to 10:00 am

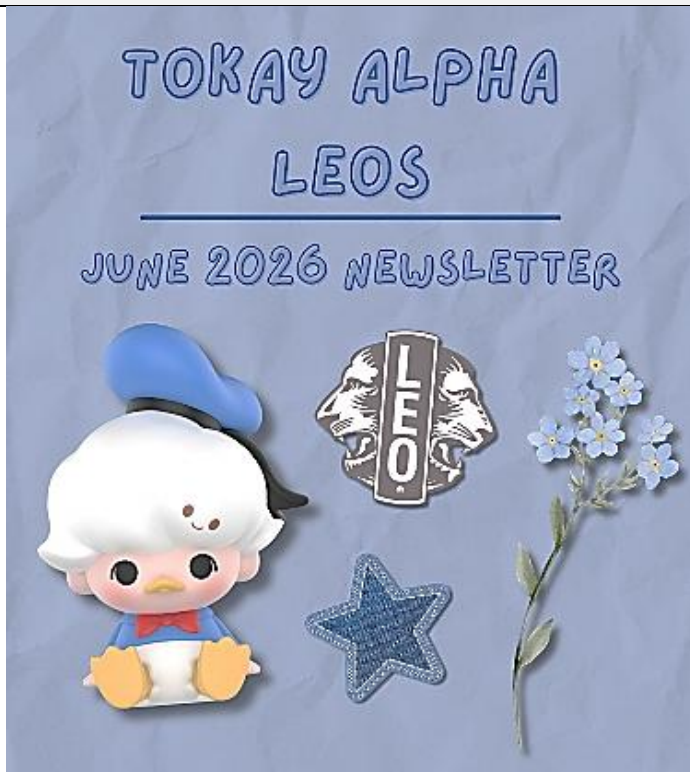

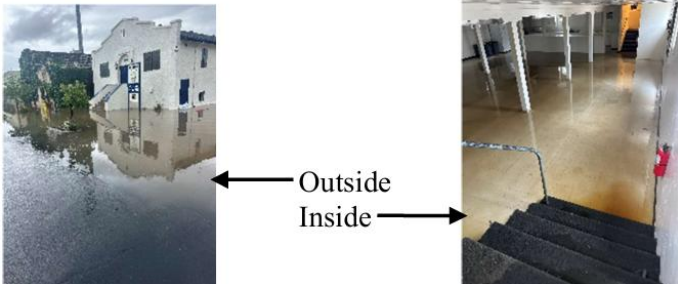
