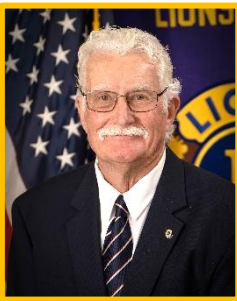

CLUBS MUST COMPLETE EACH YEAR MD4 Youth Protection Policy



Dear District 4-A1 Presidents and Secretaries:

You **should have recently received an email**, because per the MD4 Youth Protection Policy, by **July 31, 2026**,

California Lions Clubs must complete a MD4 Youth Service Compliance Form. **This form must be completed annually, even if your club does not participate in any youth service programs/activities wherein you have club members or volunteers who have direct contact or supervision of minors for 16 hours or more per month or 32 hours or more per year.** All required forms and attachments were included in that email.

The reasons why this policy was developed are threefold:

(1) it's the law (AB 506 California Business Professions Code section 18975);

(2) it's required by MD4, so that all Lions Clubs comply with the law; and

(3) it's for the protection of the children we serve and individual Lions members and volunteers, Clubs, and Districts who serve them. Child abuse and neglect is not just an issue with other service organizations, schools, and some churches. It has impacted California Lions Clubs as well. In August, 2023, a then-sitting Vice District Governor, Daniel Cortez, was convicted of child sexual assault and sentenced to 12 years in State Prison. While we sympathize with the sentiment that it is just one more thing Clubs have to do, it is an important thing to do, and we appreciate your cooperation in getting it done.

As of 7/23/26 we have received forms from Lathrop, Livingston, Jackson, Stockton Delta Pacific, Stockton Host Lions Clubs. THANK YOU!

3. Application Submission Guidelines

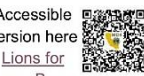
- Only the primary sponsoring/organizing Lions or Leo Club may apply

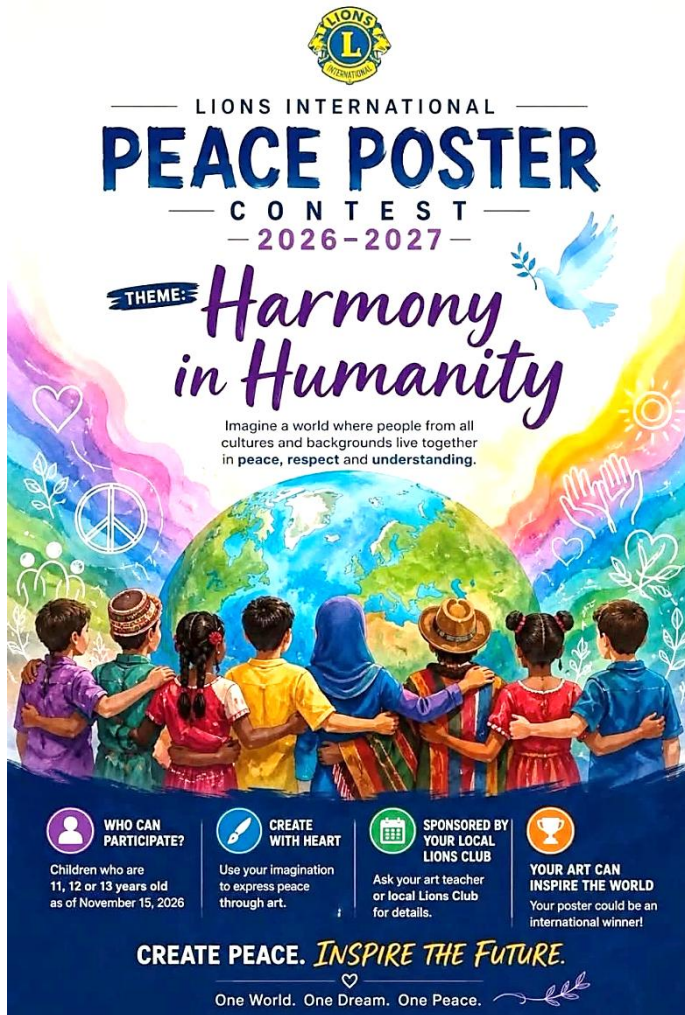

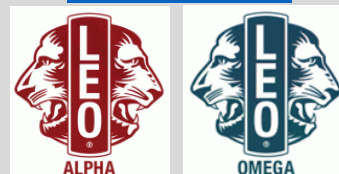

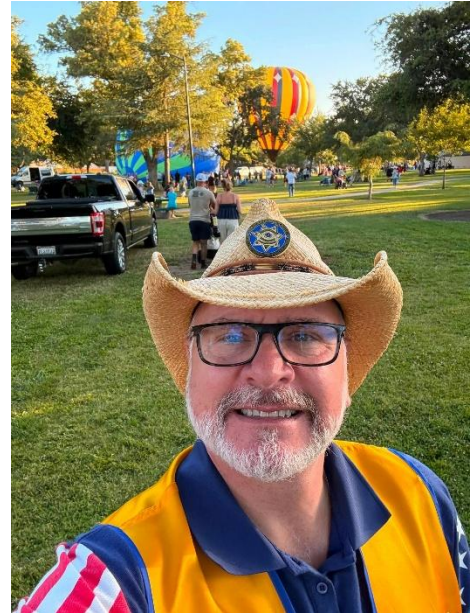
