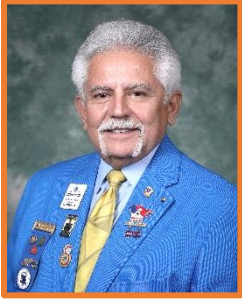

MESSAGE FROM DG STEVE MOORE



Greetings Fellow Lions of District 4-A1,

It has been a busy and productive month at the District 4-A1 level, and I'm excited to share a few updates with you!

Training Opportunities -

GLT PCC Lion Claudia Miller recently conducted two days of New Zone Chair Training in Modesto, along with New Club Officer Training in Linden.

If you have not yet completed these important initial trainings, please check the 4-A1 District Calendar for upcoming training dates. You may also contact GLT PCC Lion Claudia Miller at ckay613cayucos@gmail.com to be included in future training opportunities.

Our goal is to have 34 clubs, representing 70% of our Lions club officers, participating in officer training by October 1, 2026. Your help in reaching this goal is greatly appreciated!

Club Websites -

During the New Officer Training, I shared that the District is currently reviewing how we provide web presence and website services for our clubs. The cost of maintaining the various website options currently being used by individual clubs continues to increase.

We are exploring options that would allow clubs to continue paying for enhanced websites and services if they choose to do so. At the same time, this review will most likely result in some changes to the web services the District can provide to clubs at no or limited cost in the future.

Please stay tuned for additional information as this process develops.

Staying Connected with Our Clubs -

First VDG Lion Mike Bohl, Second VDG Lion José M. Aldaco, and I have begun making our monthly calls to District club presidents. Our goal is to strengthen communication and gain a better understanding of what each club is doing—and, more importantly, how the District can help.

Whether your club needs assistance with membership, service projects, recruiting, or other challenges, we want to hear from you.

Thank you to everyone who has taken or returned our calls. The conversations have been very encouraging, and we look forward to continuing this important connection with our clubs.

Council of Governors Meeting -

I attended the August Council of Governors (C.O.G.) meeting in Ontario, which was preceded by the Lions Float, Inc. inaugural Poker Tournament fundraiser.

The event was very well organized, and everyone appeared to have a great time. Numerous participants purchased additional chips to continue playing, which helped make the fundraiser a success.

Council Chair Lion Patrick Pothier did an outstanding job leading the meeting with confidence and courtesy. He kept the two-day meeting on schedule and was even able to conclude a little ahead of time—a wonderful accomplishment!

Council Co-Secretary DG Lion Mariane Allen expressed concern that registrations for the meeting were slower than in previous years, resulting in lower attendance.

I encourage all Lions who are able to attend future C.O.G. meetings to do so. These are the business meetings of our Multiple District, and the decisions made there directly affect Lions throughout every district in Multiple District Four.

I have also begun my official club visitations, with my first visit being with the Stockton Host Club.

I will be reaching out to club secretaries to schedule additional visits. With 47 more club visitations to go, I have a busy year ahead!

My goal is for every club visit to be informative, enjoyable, and beneficial to the club.

We are also excited to welcome our keynote speaker, Lion John Posey, Executive Director of the Lions Eye Foundation.

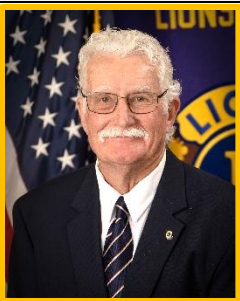
I am looking forward to seeing at least one representative from every club in District 4-A1 at this important meeting!

"From the early 1980s until he could no longer attend functions, Ron was a member of the LeGrand Lions Club. When Barbara joined him in retirement, they traveled the world, finding new ways to contribute to society and serve others through Lions. Ron's greatest talent and hobby was creating club webpages and teaching others to build and maintain their own club webpages. He also helped Barbara raise 10 puppies for the Lions Project for Canine Companions. Ron was asked to run for district governor of his area, 4A1, for Lions Club and he served in this leadership capacity for the 2015-2016 term. He took his guitar, sound system, and infectious personality to every Lions function, always making laughter and fun a part of the event. Ron and Barbara made countless friends during their time in Lions and only stopped when Ron's Parkinson's made it impossible to continue. Even when dementia was setting in, he still helped set up the sound system at his local club meeting, watched over by a younger fellow Lion, who claimed Ron could still do it better than him!"

Mr. Harrison, your generosity has helped ensure that every Scout, regardless of their circumstances, has a seat at the campfire and a pack for the trail.

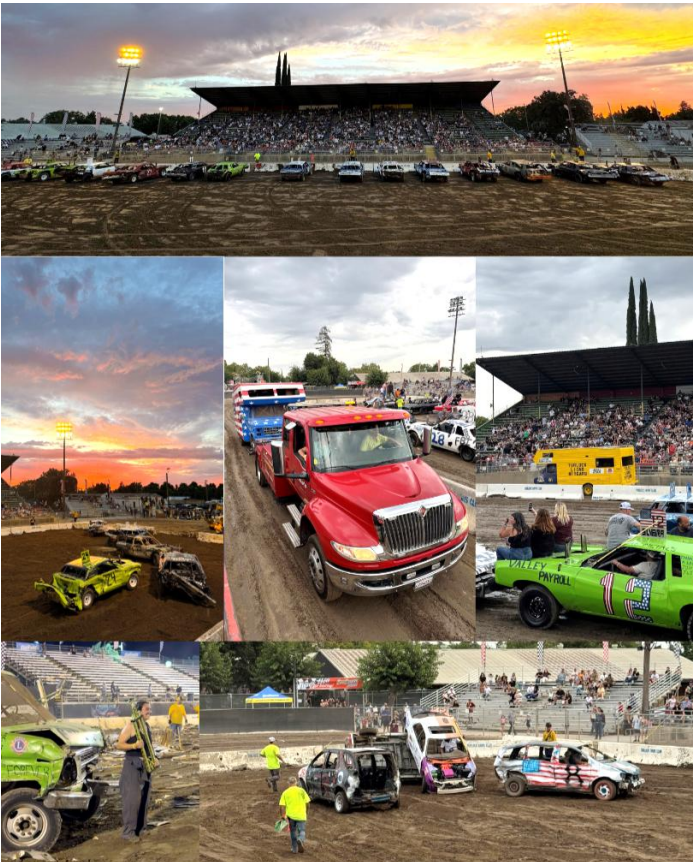

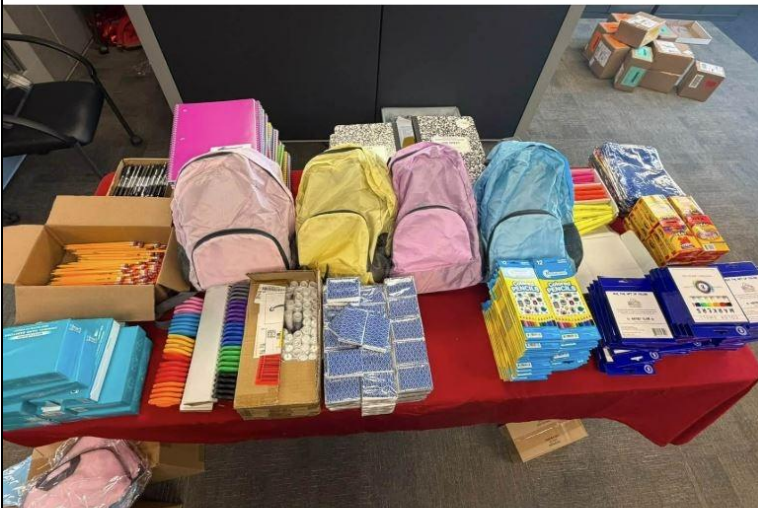
